



WHS General Construction Induction (SafeWork NSW White Card)

This course is the mandatory work health and safety training required prior to undertaking construction work in NSW. Participants will get awareness and knowledge of health and safety legislative requirements in order to work safely and prevent injury or harm to self and others.

The course covers identifying and orally reporting common construction hazards, understanding basic risk control measures, and identifying procedures for responding to potential incidents and emergencies. It also covers correctly selecting and fitting common personal protective equipment (PPE) used for construction work.

Our face to face course enables students to learn the skills they need. Coming to LGTI will suit most better training than an online course – particularly for new workers, people who learn better in a “hands on” environment, or those who have not had formal safety training previously.

People who need a white card include:

- site managers, supervisors, surveyors, labourers and tradespeople
- people who access operational construction zones (unaccompanied or not directly supervised by an inducted person)
- workers whose employment causes them to routinely enter operational construction zones.

Participants will complete theory and practical activities, working indoors and outdoors. They will undertake activities such as:

- Risk assessment of a work area
- Use and fitting of PPE
- Identification of signage and equipment

SafeWork NSW White Card Licensing

At the end of the day of training, LGTI will give you a statement that you can use to prove you have completed the training until your white card arrives in the mail to your personal address.

Participants must provide:

- 100pts proof of ID (list on next pages)
- Unique Student Identifier (USI) number

EVIDENCE OF IDENTITY INFORMATION SHEET FOR PARTICIPANTS OF HIGH RISK WORK LICENCE ASSESSMENTS

OCTOBER 2016

SafeWork NSW require all participants of high risk work licence training and assessment to provide a minimum of 100 points original evidence of identity documents.

Assessment is unable to commence until the evidence of identity documents have been sighted and recorded by the assessor.

The table below outlines the acceptable evidence of identity and points value.

EVIDENCE OF IDENTITY REQUIREMENTS

Remember:

- The combination of documents presented to the SafeWork NSW accredited assessor must include your date of birth, current NSW residential address, photograph and signature.
- Documents provided must be original. Certified copies will not be accepted.
- You may only use one primary document.
- You do not have to provide a primary document, you may use a combination of secondary documents.
- If you provide more than one credit card, savings account card or statement, they must be from different financial institutions.
- If you provide more than one utility bill, they must be from different utility providers.
- All documents provided must contain your name in full, not just your initials.

Passport – Australian or international (current or expired within last two years, but not cancelled)	70pts
Australian citizenship certificate	70pts

Current Australian learner driver's licence/permit	40pts
Current Australian boat operator's photo licence (Note: only the Personal Watercraft Licence is issued in NSW with a photo and is acceptable. The NSW non-photo boat licence is not acceptable).	40pts
Current NSW firearms photo licence	40pts
Current Australian issued high risk work photo licence	40pts
Current state/territory proof of age or photo card (for example a RMS issued photo card)	40pts
Australian defence or Police photo ID card	40pts
Department of Veterans Affairs card	25pts
Current Centrelink card	25pts

Secondary documents (continued)	
Property (council) rates notice	25pts
Property lease agreement	25pts
Home insurance document	25pts
Utility bills - for example water, electricity, gas	25pts
Telephone account	25pts
Current Medicare card	25pts
Current motor vehicle registration or insurance document	25pts
Credit/savings cards/bank statements	25pts
Correctional facility	
Correctional centre inmate master index number photo card	40pts
Correctional centre inmate master index number card	5pts
Letter of verification from the department of corrective services	25pts

Note: Corrective services evidence of identity documentation is only applicable to inmates of correctional facilities.
